

PRDC FUNDING

The Prescott and Russell Development Corporation (PRDC), sponsored by <u>FedDev</u> <u>Ontario</u>, continues to deliver its mandate to encourage the development and diversification of the local economy. We offer various funding options for all your entrepreneurial projects.



### **Investment Fund Ioan**

The <u>Investment Fund</u> loan provides a funding source up to a maximum of \$300,000 to new and existing businesses in the Prescott and Russell regions. This source of financing is structured with flexible repayment terms and, an assessment of your project's viability, and assistance in obtaining realistic funding.



### Young Entrepreneur loan

The <u>Young Entrepreneur</u> loan has been created to reduce the outmigration of young people towards urban centers and aims at supporting young entrepreneurs from 18 to 39 years of age in the Prescott and Russell regions with available funding ranging from \$5,000 to \$30,000. This program promotes leadership in young people and values their social, cultural, and economic engagement in our communities.



### **Express** loan

The Express loan was created to support the operational continuity of businesses in the Prescott and Russell regions. Funding up to a maximum of \$15,000 for expenses such as leasehold improvements, increasing inventory, helping with working capital, improving or updating equipment, and marketing, to name a few. A decision could be transmitted within 72 business hours of receiving the application.



### **EDISO** loan

The Economic Development Initiative of Southern Ontario (EDISO) loan is dedicated to francophone and bilingual businesses in southern Ontario, including rural and urban areas. This program offers funding up to a maximum of \$30,000 and is designed to strengthen the foundation, sustainability, and competitiveness in southern Ontario.

# NEW FUNDING OPTION AND TOOLS



### Line of credit

To further support entrepreneurs and businesses in achieving their entrepreneurial goals, the PRDC now offers a new financing option, a line of credit. This option can either be paired with the Investment Fund loan or applicants can opt for a line of credit only.

The maximum financial assistance of \$150 000 in the form of a line of credit provided by the investment fund is offered to incorporated SMEs only. The borrower can borrow money from his/her line of credit in whole or in part, according to his/her needs and with proof of justified invoices. The funds can be used for a variety of reasons, including:

- business expansion;
- · leasehold improvements;
- cash flow management;
- cash flow for contract purposes;
- bill payment;
- unexpected expenses.

Interest is generally paid on the amount used, meaning the amount disbursed by the PRDC, and not on the amount of the credit line allocated. The interest rates associated with a line of credit can be variable or fixed, depending on the terms of the agreement between the parties and the PRDC preferential current rate.

A line of credit may be secured by assets such as real estate, inventory, accounts receivable, or other valuable assets, as well as general and specific security agreements.

A line of credit cannot be used to acquire or start a business or to pay government taxes.

These documents can be downloaded and are fillable for your convenience.

### LOAN CALCULATOR

The <u>loan calculator</u> will allow you to calculate your monthly payments based on the loan amount, term, and interest rate and will help you determine how much you can afford to borrow based on your revenues. Please note: this is a basic loan calculator and does not take into consideration the flexible terms and reimbursements we can offer.
