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

There are times becoming an entrepreneur is not always a lifelong dream, not even something you have ever contemplated. There are times your passion for your service or product does not stem from the hopes of becoming your own boss, financial stability, or being born creative and innovative. Our next story is about a woman entrepreneur who has discovered her inner strength and devotion to a cause that was otherwise unknown to her. This is how Anne-Marie Chartrand went from a full-time, dedicated career woman and volunteer firefighter to a businesswoman with a specific goal.

Anne-Marie is a proud mom of 2. In 2020, her youngest child developed medical problems. After a somewhat lengthy stay at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO), a battery of tests performed on her then 2.5-year-old son revealed the causes of his symptoms. He was then diagnosed with a few conditions, among them was Level 2 autism. This, as you can imagine, turned her world upside down. He was no longer a playful, feisty, bubbly little boy so, Anne-Marie picked herself up and was determined to see that her son had the best quality of life, the best care, and the best tools to help him cope. Her main questions were ... what is this? What do I do now? Where do I go? What services are available? And thus began her ongoing journey into Autism research. Thankfully, the staff at CHEO were able

to get her started by referring a few organizations. Among them are the Valoris Foundation of Prescott-Russell and Regroupement Autisme Prescott-Russell. Anne-Marie can't thank them enough for their guidance and assistance. It has been and still is priceless to her.


While seeing the different challenges her son has developed with this diagnossis, Anne-Marie noticed that he tended to chew on his shirt or jacket collar, especially when he felt anxious or stressed. Knowing this was unhealthy and potentially dangerous, she began looking into products that might help him alleviate his anxiety. Exploring, researching, and inquiring wherever she could. Astonished, she discovered there was no product for that specific oral sensory fixation. Her drive to help her son led her to more research. She will develop her own product. She began her process by designing and developing her own prototype. With the help of a seamstress neighbor, she created the very first Sensory Chewing Neck Gaiter. An accessory that is worn around the neck with a velcro closure at the back and a silicone chewable element at the front. Needless to say, she was thrilled to see how her product immensely helped her son and is convinced it can help so many others. Adults, teenagers and children with autism, ADHD, ADD, anxiety or other sensory-related conditions can benefit from this discreet oral sensory tool. Even a teething baby may find relief with this product.

Her ultimate goal is to create more products to aid and assist those affected by sensory fixations and offer solutions but also to create awareness. Unfortunately, families with children (or adults) diagnosed with autism have very little supportive assistance or programs in the area and Anne-Marie firmly believes that must change.

Originally from Venezuela, Vanessa Teran came to Canada in 2012 as part of a post-secondary youth exchange program to study Marketing and Technology with a focus on FinTech. This young woman stayed in the Greater Toronto Area to pursue her career in tourism as a sales marketing manager. But her lifelong passion for boating and saving local biodiversity soon motivated her to research the issues of aquatic invasive species and how watercraft are the main carriers of foreign invaders that change the climate on our Ontario Great Lakes. That is where her entrepreneurial journey began, the potential impact that boats have on the marine ecosystem. But she did not stop there. Being an impactful and socially driven entrepreneur. Her business concept is as unique as it is diverse.

AQUA Services Group

With the recent boom of boating enthusiasts and the demand for boating maintenance, Vanessa founded AQUA Services Group in 2020. Raising awareness for the aquatic ecosystem was one goal, however, this young entrepreneur also felt the need to address the unemployment issue, especially within the under-represented community and advocate on their behalf. Being a relatively newcomer to Canada, Vanessa created a platform to provide opportunities to minorities within the Greater Toronto Area. Justice, equity, diversity and inclusion are central to her business. Her 6 full-time and 4 part-time employees are all part of minority groups, including her parents whom she brought from Venezuela in 2019. But how did AQUA Services Group begin? Word of mouth of course. Vanessa created her own

personal network by visiting boaters, one by one, educating them and offering her services. That first summer season was a success! But because this was a seasonal venture. Vanessa did not waste time during the off-season. She wanted to expand, to service other areas, to further her own goals and to ensure her continuing commitment to the employment impact of newcomers. Her next plan was to offer the same high-quality cleaning and maintenance service commercially and residentially. Being a very resourceful person, Vanessa sought new ways to increase her clientele. One way was to become a part-time Uber driver. She believes there is power in telling your story and in describing what makes you unique. And so she shared, and they listened.

Little by little, she obtained more contracts and her business grew. And Vanessa's quest for knowledge and perfection in her field grew as well. Numerous training for her and her staff, partnerships with organizations for Health and Safety, Green Clean-Up, and Supplier trainings. Business accelerator programs, membership in the Women's Chamber of Commerce and participating in a podcast panel for Start-Up Canada, just to name a few.

Vanessa's favorite aspect of being an entrepreneur is being able to write her career and create her own path on her own terms and rules. Her secret to success is focusing on the WHY at all times, especially when making business decisions. She stays motivated by pursuing more businesses and looking into innovative ways to address and solve different problems in the industry. Success equals progress. Knowing the service she provides is enhancing her community's lifestyle is a great motto to keep moving forward.

One tiny regret is if she to do it all over, she would begin with a business plan. "It doesn't have to be perfect, but it guides you better",

The Prescott-Russell Community Development Corporation (PRCDC), sponsored by FedDev Ontario, continues to deliver its mandate to encourage the development and diversification of local the economy. We offer various funding options for all your entrepreneurial projects.



Investment fund loan

The Investment Fund loan provides a funding source up to a maximum of \$300,000 to new and existing businesses in the Prescott and Russell region. This source of financing is structured with flexible repayment terms and an assessment of your project's viability and assistance in obtaining realistic funding.

Young entrepreneur loan

The Young Entrepreneur loan has been created to reduce the outmigration of young people towards urban centers and aims at supporting young entrepreneurs from 18 to 35 years of age in the Prescott and Russell region with available funding ranging from \$5,000 to \$30,000. This program promotes leadership in young people and values their social, cultural and economic engagement in our communities.



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Express loan

The Express loan is created to support the operational continuity of businesses in the Prescott and Russell region. Funding up to a maximum of \$15,000 for expenses such as leasehold improvements, increase inventory, help with working capital, improve or update equipment and marketing, to name a few. 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

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12 CHARACTERISTICS OF CRITICAL THINKERS

In essence, critical thinking requires you to use your ability to reason. It is about being an active learner rather than a passive recipient of information. Critical thinkers rigorously question ideas and assumptions rather than accepting them at face value. They will always seek to determine whether the ideas, arguments and findings respect the entire picture and are open to finding that they do not. Critical thinkers will identify, analyze and solve problems systematically rather than by intuition or instinct.

OBSERVATION is one of the earliest critical thinking skills we learn as children. It is our ability to perceive and understand the world around us. Careful observation includes our ability to document details and to collect data through our senses. Our observations will eventually lead to insight and a deeper understanding of the world around us.

CURIOSITY is a core trait of many successful leaders. Being inherently inquisitive and interested in the world and people around you is a hallmark of leaders who are critical thinkers. Instead of taking everything at face value, a curious person will wonder why something is the way it is. As we get older, it is easier to put aside what may seem like childish curiosity. Curiosity forces you to keep an open mind and propels you to gain deeper knowledge, all of which are also fundamental to being a lifelong learner.

OBJECTIVITY Good critical thinkers are able to stay as objective as possible when looking at information or a situation. They focus on facts, and on scientific evaluation of the information at hand. Objective thinkers seek to keep their emotions (and those of others) from affecting their judgment. However, it is impossible for people to remain completely objective because we are all shaped by our points of view, our life experiences and our perspectives. Being aware of our biases is the first step to being objective and looking at an issue dispassionately. Once you are able to remove yourself from the situation, you can more thoroughly analyze it.

INTROSPECTION This is the art of being aware of your thinking, or, to put it another way, thinking about how you think about things. Critical thinkers need introspection so they are aware of their own degree of alertness and attentiveness, as well as their biases. This is your ability to examine your innermost thoughts, feelings and sensations. Introspection is closely related to self-reflection, which gives you insight into your emotional and mental state.

ANALYTICAL THINKING The best analytical thinkers are also critical thinkers, and vice versa. The ability to analyze information is key when looking at almost anything, whether it is a contract, report, business model or even a relationship. Analyzing information means breaking information down into its component parts and evaluating how well those parts function together and separately. The analysis relies on observation; on gathering and evaluating evidence so you can come to a meaningful conclusion. Analytical thinking begins with objectivity.

IDENTIFYING BIASES Critical thinkers challenge themselves to identify the evidence that forms their beliefs and assess whether or not those sources are credible. Doing this helps you understand your own biases and question your preconceived notions. This is an important step in becoming aware of how biases intrude on your thinking and recognizing when information may be skewed. When looking at information, ask yourself who the information benefits. Does the source of this information have an agenda? Does the source overlook or leave out information that does not support its claims and beliefs?

DETERMINING RELEVANCE One of the most difficult parts of critical thinking is figuring out what information is the most relevant, meaningful and important for your consideration. In many scenarios, you will be presented with information that may seem valuable, but it may turn out to be only a minor data point to consider. Consider if a source of information is logically relevant to the issue

point to consider. Consider if a source of information is logically relevant to the issue being discussed. Is it truly useful and unbiased, or it is merely distracting from a more pertinent point?

INFERENCE Information does not always come with a summary that spells out exactly what it means. Critical thinkers need to assess the information and draw conclusions based on raw data. Inference is the ability to extrapolate meaning from data and discover potential outcomes when assessing a scenario. It is also important to understand the difference between inferences and assumptions. For example, if you see data that someone weighs 260 pounds, you might assume they are overweight or unhealthy. However, other data points like height and body composition may alter that conclusion.

COMPASSION AND EMPATHY Having compassion and empathy may seem like a negative for critical thinkers. After all, being sentimental and emotional can skew our perception of a situation. But the point of having compassion is to have concern for others and to value the welfare of other people. Without compassion, we would view all information and situations from the viewpoint of cold, heartless scientific facts and data. It would be easy to allow our cynicism to become toxic and to be suspicious of everything we look at. But to be a good critical thinker, we must always take into account the human element. Not everything we do is about detached data and information, it is also about people.

HUMILITY is the willingness to acknowledge one's shortcomings and see one's positive attributes in an accurate way. When you have humility, you are aware of your flaws, but also your strengths and this is an important element in critical thinking and being willing to stretch and open your mind and are open to other people's viewpoints. You recognize when you are wrong and are willing to challenge your own beliefs when necessary.

WILLING TO CHALLENGE THE STATUS QUO Critical thinking means questioning long-established business practices and refusing to adhere to traditional methods simply because that's the way it has always been done. Critical thinkers are looking for smart, thoughtful answers and methods that take into account all the current and relevant information and practices available. Their willingness to challenge the status quo may seem controversial, but it is an essential part of the creative and innovative mind of a critical thinker.

OPEN-MINDEDNESS Being able to step back from a situation and not become embroiled helps critical thinkers see the broader view. Critical thinkers avoid launching into a frenzied argument or taking sides, they want to hear all perspectives. Critical thinkers don't jump to conclusions. They approach a question or situation with

an open mind and embrace other opinions and views.
